

# 2010 Team USA Selection Process

The International Committee, with the approval of the Executive Council, has changed the process and procedure for selection of the 2010 Team USA members. There will NO longer be Selection Shoots or mandatory attendance at certain shoots. It will now be based on a Team USA Points System and will be posted on MYNSCA.COM and updated on the first of every month.

## Team USA Sporting

All Sporting Clays Shoots with at least 100 targets and 100 shooters or more in all 12 gauge English sporting events whether Main or Prelim will qualify for Team USA Sporting Points. Team USA Sporting Points are calculated the same as All-American Points. These points can be earned only in 12 gauge English sporting events and NOT Small Gauge, 5-Stand, Compak or FITASC. This program is for determining only TEAM USA Sporting Members and does not affect by any means, the All-American Team selection process. These points will be updated and posted on the website on the first of every month; the first posting will be March 1<sup>st</sup>. The Teams will be completely selected by this point system. The top 5 Shooters in Open and the top 3 Shooters in Junior, Lady, Veteran and Super Vet will make the Team. Alternates, if needed, will be chosen by the shooter with the next highest points in their respective concurrent.

### Concurrents:

If you are 54 or 64 and will be 55 or 65 by the following Jan. 1<sup>st</sup> you will be awarded points as if you were already in next years concurrent so that you do not have to sit out a year. Anyone that has not reached his or her 21<sup>st</sup> birthday by Jan. 1<sup>st</sup> the year of the competition year will be considered a Junior. Senior Super Veterans will be competing to make the Super Veteran Team.

## Team USA FITASC

All FITASC events with 100 targets, whether they are main events or side events with 50 or more shooters, will qualify for Team USA FITASC Points. Points will be awarded on the same basis as Team USA Sporting Points. The remaining criteria will be the same as Sporting except there will be only 4 members on the Open Team. The Concurrent age requirements will be based on the same criteria stated above for Sporting. The exception to this is when shooting in a foreign country; Juniors must NOT have had their 21<sup>st</sup> birthday before the beginning of the competition. Again – do not confuse this with All-American Points – nothing has changed there!
